Chatter Cards are designed to be taken with you when you are out and about. You could take them on the bus, attach them to the pushchair using the silver ring, or keep them in your bag.

You can take cards on and off the ring, make and add your own cards, or stick them on the fridge to remind you to take time to talk today!

Be careful that the silver ring is closed properly so that it can't hurt your child.

Here are some ideas to help you develop your child's language and learning using the outdoors. Learning doesn't only happen at school or nursery. It happens everywhere you go. You can help your child learn words and communication skills while you go to the shops, play outdoors, sit on the bus...all the time!

Picnics



Why not have a teddy bears picnic?

You can invite dolls, dinosaurs and other toys too.

Talk about how many cups you might need or what sort of food you might take to your picnic.



Talk about what the weather is like today.

What sort of clothes shall we wear?

Talk about the weather sounds that you can hear, like the rain, wind and thunder.

Make some noisy rainmakers using empty plastic bottles. Put rice or pasta inside your bottle so it makes a lovely sound when you shake it.

Sing songs such as 'it's raining it's pouring.'



Go for a walk to the local park.

Make a list or pictures of six things you might see on the way, such as a leaf, a pebble, a dog, a park bench etc.

You can use lots of maths words in the park such as "up" and "down", "high" and "low" or "heavy" and "light" on the swings and seesaw.

Sand and water



Use an old plastic tray or baby bath and fill it with play sand.

Have a treasure hunt in your sand tray. Hide lots of interesting objects such as cones or shells.

Fill an old bowl with water add some glitter or bubbles. Have fun filling and pouring your water using old teapots, funnels, yoghurt pots and jugs.

Describe textures or the appearance of objects such as rough, shiny.



Write a letter to someone special. This could be someone in your family or your child's friends at nursery.

Take the letter to the postbox together. Talk about the journey your letter will take, and who will look after it.

Talk about other people we see when you are out and about, such as a shopkeeper or a policeman.





Listen for sounds when you are out and about.

Talk about quiet and loud sounds, such as a noisy bus.

When you get home try to remember all the sounds you have heard.

Have fun trying to remember and make the sounds together.



Talk about keeping safe and crossing the road together.

Talk about the colours and sizes of different cars and vans.

Look for numbers on buses or car registration plates.

Guess what colour the next car to come past will be.

Talk about where you might go in a car, train, or an aeroplane.



When you go shopping, let your child help you find things in the supermarket. Why not make them a simple list using pictures.

Talk about which things are lighter and heavier, such as a tin of beans or a packet of crisps.

Talk about the colours of things such as pink shampoo or yellow bananas.



Make a den.

Use rugs and blankets to make a den.

Act out your favourite story in your den or read a book together

You can pretend your den is a house, cave or a spaceship!

Invite your teddies round for tea in the den.



Collect things like leaves, twigs and daisies.

Count how many are in your pile.

Talk to your child. Listen to their ideas while you sort your treasures together.

Digging is a good way to find interesting things like creepy crawlies.



There are lots of songs about things you might find outside.

Have fun together singing some of the songs on the following pages.
