








# Education Attainment of Children Looked After

## KS2: Percent attaining Level 4+







### KS2 English: Percent attaining Level 4+





### KS3 English: Percent attaining Level 5+




% of Y9 Pupils

### KS3 Mathematics: Percent attaining Level 5+






### KS3 ICT: Percent attaining Level 5+



### KS4 GCSE/GNVQ: Average Total Points attained by Y11 Students (uncapped)




