Child Exploitation

Child Exploitation is a form of child abuse, referring to the exploitation of any child or young person under the age of 18.

Child Exploitation can take many forms. Often children are subjected to more than one form of exploitation at a time. Child Exploitation happens when an individual or group takes advantage of an imbalance of power to coerce, manipulate or deceive a child into sexual or criminal activity.

Any child can be targeted for exploitation regardless of their age, gender, culture or religion.

Perpetrators can be male or female from any culture, community or religion.

It might appear consensual, and the child might not recognise that they are a victim of abuse.
