## A Brief History

The first discussions of the need for a crematorium to serve the fast growing City of Coventry were at a meeting held in 1934. On 29th April 1938 the Ministry of Health approved the building of a crematorium and the establishment of a new cemetery at the same location. Work commenced on site in the late spring of 1939, but experienced delays almost immediately due to the onset of the 2<sup>nd</sup> World War, as there was a shortage of materials and skilled labour available. It was the air raids of 14th & 15th November 1940, which focused the attention on the need to complete the project.

On Tuesday 23<sup>rd</sup> February 1943 Alderman Emily Smith, J.P. the Worshipful the Mayor of Coventry, formally opened Canley Garden Cemetery and Crematorium. The 1<sup>st</sup> cremation took place on 26<sup>th</sup> February 1943 some 3 days after the formal opening, and the 1<sup>st</sup> interment was carried out 27<sup>th</sup> March 1943.

As an ongoing effort to improve services delivered to the citizens of Coventry a project commenced on site to build an additional chapel on to the existing crematorium building. Work started to construct Cannon Hill Chapel 29<sup>th</sup> June 1992, and was completed on 12<sup>th</sup> May 1993.

The completion of the project has seen the transformation of a pre-war designed building to one that is now able to meet the demands and expectations of the bereaved of today.

There are two chapels available at Canley Crematorium, Cannon Hill and Charter; they each have their own driveway and car park which are named after the road you would use to access them.

Both chapels are available for funeral and memorial services. These bookings can be made through your Funeral Director or directly by yourself should you be coordinating your own funeral arrangements. The allocated time for a booking is 45 minutes. The chapels have a specialised music system available or you may wish to provide your own organist for the service.

Gardens of Remembrance
