Those seeking the solace of quiet contemplation and those who appreciate the beauty of well maintained gardens are very welcome to visit.

Gardens of Remembrance

The gardens are made up from several different areas including the Traditional Rose Garden, Seasonal areas and The Woodlands.

Following the cremation, you may wish for the cremated remains of your loved one to be strewn in the Gardens of Remembrance. These arrangements can be made through your Funeral Director or directly with Coventry Bereavement Services.

Bereavement Services will retain a record of the area where the strewing has taken place.

Questions and Answers

Q: Can I put floral tributes in the gardens?

A: Yes, but those tributes must be cut flowers only with all of the wrapping and cellophane removed.

Q: Will my tributes be removed?
A: Yes, we will remove tributes, which have dried out from the lawns and rose beds approximately every seven days.

Q: Can I plant my own flowers, roses or shrubs etc?

A: You may only plant your own items in the areas located around a leased Individual Garden (see memorial leaflet for more information.) You are not permitted to plant in any other areas of the gardens.

Q: Can I put my tributes in a vase, or bring a planter?

A: No, vases or planters are not acceptable within the gardens as they create obstructions, and if broken can cause harm to others.

Q: Do you have a Book of Remembrance?

A: Yes, our Book of Remembrance is located in the Book Room.

Q: Do you supply memorialisation in the Gardens of remembrance?
