Please could you provide me with some information regarding user engagement and your use of open source and open standards for your digital services?

### **User engagement**

1. When did you last conduct research into how your website users are accessing digital services?

This is done on a daily basis both with qualitative information from surveys and ad-hoc information from individuals as well as quantitative data from automated systems.

2. How has your digital uptake increased over the past 12 months (as measured by the government's guidelines)?

# 3. What percentage of your source code your council develops - or which is developed on your behalf by external parties - is made open?

We do not currently have any internally developed open-source systems. We rarely commission third parties to do development work on our behalf, although in these cases, we are not aware of them being open-source.

## 4. What percentage of your components are standard government technology components?

You have not provided a definition for what is meant by standard government technology components. However we can confirm that we design and develop solutions following the Government Digital Service design principles who are signatories of the Local Digital Declaration.

We currently use GOV.UK Notify for service areas to communicate to users and text/email notifications on some services available via MyAccount.
