Thank you for your request for information relating to long-term care placements and CCG funded inpatient rehabilitation for neurological conditions.

You have requested the following information:

This Freedom of Information request is being placed to enable myself and colleagues to establish demand and capacity for CHC/Social Services long-term care placements and CCG funded rehabilitation (Level 3/slow-stream/neuro-behavioural) for patients presenting with neurological conditions, including but not exclusive to, Acquired Brain Injury, Stroke, Parkinson's Disease, Multiple Sclerosis, Spinal Cord Injury, Huntingdon's Disease and Motor Neurone Disease.

1. For each of the last 3 financial years, how many patients with the above neurological conditions have been assessed as eligible for Social Services funded care?

We advise that the Council does not capture/record eligibility in a reportable format so numbers shown in the table below, are based on people who received a service within the last three financial years. Please note the data also only captures the first eligible service for a client within the criteria and does not account for subsequent increase in service.
