To avoid disappointment, we advise you enrol as early as possible.

COURSES REQUIRING AN INTERVIEW

When you find a course on our website you are interested in joining, it may say you need to attend an appointment for an enrolment interview to join. We conduct interviews so that we can make sure the course is at an appropriate level for you and to check whether you are eligible for government funding. (If not, you will still be able to join, but there will be a fee to do so.)

IMPORTANT – when attending an enrolment interview, you must bring the following:

· Identification:

If you are a UK National, please bring your birth certificate, driving licence or British passport.

If you are an EU citizen, please bring your passport/ID card and a share code generated within the last 90 days.

If you are currently seeking Asylum, please bring your ARC card and Aspen card (if applicable).

Otherwise, you will need to generate a sharecode for your online eVisa document to prove your residency status.

(If you have not yet applied for your eVisa, please bring your residence permit (BRP), passport with visa or whatever documentation you have that shows your residency status.)



 Evidence of relevant benefits or income:

If your gross personal income is less than £34,194 per annum. (This is one of the criteria that allow us to claim government funding.)

· Your national insurance number.

LANGUAGE SKILLS

COMMUNITY INTERPRETING

Do you want to learn about the role of a community interpreter? Do you have an interest in working with different language groups? Do you want to help others be understood in English?

We offer Community Interpreting courses for those who are interested in finding out more about a qualification and career in interpreting. We have a Preparation for Level 1 Award in Understanding Community Interpreting – Study Skills course running in Autumn 2025. You can then enrol on the 20 week 60 hour Ascentis Level 1 Award in Understanding Community Interpreting running from January 26.

If you have already achieved a Level 1 qualification in Community Interpreting or feel you have the equivalent skills already then we have a Level 2 Certificate in Preparing for the Community Interpreting Role course running from September 2025. This course runs twice a week in the daytime.

BRITISH SIGN LANGUAGE & MAKATON

Are you interested in learning or improving communication skills

through signing? Why not join one of our BSL or Makaton courses.

We have British Sign Language (BSL) and Makaton classes for those who want to learn to communicate effectively through sign. Today there are over 150,000 BSL users in the UK and 100,000 children and adults use Makaton symbols and signs to communicate. We have 10-week introductory BSL courses and 33- and 36-week Level 1 and Level 2 BSL qualification courses available in the daytime or evening. We also have 5-week Basic Makaton courses running regularly in the evening.

You will develop basic communication skills in Spanish, but the main focus will be to develop positive self-belief and enhance overall confidence and self-esteem.

You will learn to: Identify personal strengths, understand and use positive body language, exchange greetings, introduce yourself and talk about friends, family and self in Spanish.

ESOL (English for Speakers of **Other Languages)**

Do you need to learn English to live and work in the UK? Why not join one of our ESOL courses.

We have English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) courses for those who want to learn to understand, speak and write in English. You will learn English language skills for living and working in the UK. We also offer work and life skills courses specifically for ESOL learners such as ESOL for Driving, Volunteering for ESOL learners and ESOL for Cooking and Food Hygiene.

What type of ESOL class do you want?

We have classes at all levels from Beginner/Pre-Entry level to Advanced/Level 1. ESOL classes focus on speaking and listening, reading and writing at your level. We have face-to-face classes in different venues around the city and online options for higher level learners. Classes are in the morning, afternoon or evening.

We have mainstream ESOL courses which meet twice a week and intensive 4-day courses such as our ESOL Foundation Programme or our Intensive ESOL for Work courses. In our mainstream ESOL classes, you can learn about things which help you with everyday life that will help you to live and work in the UK and you will work towards a City & Guilds qualification at Entry Level or at Level 1.

On our ESOL Foundation Programme, you will learn English, improve your digital and/or vocational skills as well as working on a project to put your language learning into practice. Intensive ESOL for Work classes focus on language for employment and provide wrap around support to help you to look for work.

What will you learn in your ESOL class?

You will do an assessment so that we can see what language you need to practice to improve your English language skills. You will talk to your tutor to tell them where and when you need to speak English to help you with living in Coventry and your future plans. You will then set an Individual Learning Plan with your tutor. You will

practise speaking and listening, reading and writing at your level.

How can you join an ESOL class?

You will need to meet the West Midlands Combined Authority eligibility criteria to enrol on an ESOL course so we will need to check your passport/residence card/evisa/EUSS share code and payslips/benefit information at an enrolment session. If you are seeking asylum, you need to have lived in the UK for 6 months or have refugee status. You will also have an assessment when you enrol to check your starting level of English.

If all the appointments are full, we will ask you to ring back to book onto our October 2025 enrolment sessions.

English for Work

If you are Entry 2/A2, Entry 3/B1 or Level 1/B2 level and looking for work and are interested in an intensive ESOL course for employment with specialist wrap around support, our Coventry Language and Intergration Project is for you.

LIFE SKILLS

We offer a range of exciting courses to build confidence, improve health and wellbeing, develop new skills, gain qualifications and equip parents and carers to support their children's learning. We provide a strong focus on First Step provision to further learning, volunteering combined with a line of sight to work or employment. Programmes of learning include Family Learning, The Study Programme, Inclusive Learning, Engagement and Employability Skills Programme and The Community and Leisure Programmes.

FAMILY LEARNING

Our Family Learning provision promotes strong, positive relationships within families, enabling parents and carers to support their children's learning and development.

Our vibrant range of programmes are designed specifically for families and provides an excellent opportunity to meet other people with children of a similar age to share ideas and experiences.

Sessions are always free, and open to all parents / carers of children aged 0-11, whatever their experience or ability. The Family Learning team are all qualified teachers with recent and relevant school experience, each holding a current DBS disclosure.

Our courses are not accredited (so no assessments or exams), and usually last for 2 hours per week, over five or ten weeks. You will get a certificate of completion at the end of a group. We spend time in sessions demonstrating and making inexpensive games to make learning fun and provide free resources for families to use at home with their children.

Family Learning sessions take place in schools, family hubs, and community venues across the city.

Free Family Learning courses and programmes include:

Maths/English in the Primary School (adults

Only) – This course helps parents and carers to understand how these subjects are taught in Modern British Primary Schools. You will learn the maths methods, words and activities used in Coventry schools to support your child's learning. You will practice the correct phonics sounds and explore ways to help your child with reading. There is also a focus on the grammar, spelling and handwriting taught in English primary schools. Each week you will be given fun games to take home and play with your children. There is an online pre-recorded version of this course if you cannot attend a face-to-face course.

Positive Family Foundations (adults only) - A nurture-based, practical advice programme providing insight on how children aged 0 - 10 years old interact with their parent/carers and what children need to thrive. This evidence-based approach can help parents cope with challenging behaviour and understand more about children's development. Techniques such as Emotion Coaching are covered to encourage parents to understand how they can calmly and positively influence behaviour. There is an online pre-recorded version of this course if you cannot attend a face-to-face course.

'It was great to listen to other parents. There were lots of ideas on the course - I found the section on Emotion Coaching really helped at home.'

'50 Things to Do Before You're Five'

(adults and their children aged 0-5) - Stay and play sessions for parents and their pre-school aged children which provide resources to encourage understanding of children's learning and development. A range of fun, free and affordable ideas and activities inspired by the '50 Things to Do Before You're Five' app: coventry.50thingstodo.org

Baby Massage – (parents and carers with a baby aged from 6 weeks to 6 months – pre-crawlers) Simple massage techniques to use with your baby while in the group and at home. Baby massage is proven to help to ease your baby's colic pain, stimulate positive brain activity, strengthen attachment and help with sleep patterns of both baby and parents.

ESSENTIAL SKILLS

MATHS FUNCTIONAL SKILLS

Our courses help you improve your maths and enable you to gain nationally recognised qualifications. The classes are for people who feel they want to start from the basics, right up to those preparing for

Maths GCSE.

We run both daytime and evening classes at venues throughout the city, as well as online classes. Please note that even if you join an online course, we currently only offer face-to-face enrolments and exams are all paper-based, taken at one of our venues. Classes are 2½ hours a week over the school year, aiming at taking exams in

the summer term. If you need an exam before this, please speak to someone at enrolment.

Functional Skills Maths study enables you to achieve a nationally recognised qualification. You will improve your maths skills and increase your confidence to use these skills in everyday situations. This includes: at work, helping your children/grandchildren with their maths, gaining entry to further/higher education and coping in a modern world where maths skills are essential.

Functional Skills Maths qualifications are at 5 different levels from Entry Level 1 (E1) up to Level 2 (L2). You will work towards the most appropriate level, depending on your ability in maths when you start. Before you are enrolled onto a maths course, you will receive advice & guidance and will be offered an initial assessment. This will help you make an informed choice about the best class for you.

The classes focus on the kind of maths adults need in their everyday lives and include solving calculations, problem solving, using fractions, decimals and percentages, understanding the metric system and interpreting graphs and charts.

SHORT MATHS BRUSH-UP CLASSES

If you are thinking about improving your maths but the thought of joining a maths class worries you, we can help! We are running **short five-week courses** aimed at improving maths confidence. This may lead to joining a Functional Skills class later in the year, but it could just be about building up your skills in a non-pressured environment. You will learn about how to work with everyday maths, from the weekly shop to planning that DIY project you've been putting off!

MATHS COURSES TAILORED TO YOU

Tailored Learning maths courses are offered morning, afternoon and evening across Coventry throughout the year. Furthermore, we can offer bespoke maths and numeracy courses for individuals, employers, and voluntary community sector organisations. These courses can be delivered in a venue of your choice, whether that is in an Adult Education venue, community centre, or in the workplace.

FINANCIAL LITERACY COURSES:

We cover a range of finance topics, including:

- · Managing Personal Finances
- Understanding Payslips and Tax Code
- Understanding Pensions and Interest Rates
- · Financial Fundamentals for the self-employed

Course Availability

We are confident we will be able to offer you a class to suit you.

Maths Skill Level: Classes are targeted at those people who don't have GCSE maths at Grade C/4 yet. If you struggle with maths, we will be able to help you, no matter how weak your maths skills are.

If you need higher level maths beyond GCSE, unfortunately we are not able to offer anything at this level.

HOW TO ENROL

To enrol on a course, you must bring proof of identity and proof of your residency status in the UK.

All classes will need viable numbers and after enrolments you may be asked to consider moving to a different day/time if your class doesn't have enough enrolments. Managers will aim to meet the needs of all learners.



ENGLISH FUNCTIONAL SKILLS

READING, WRITING, SPEAKING AND LISTENING

If you speak English but need help improving your reading and writing these courses are for you, they will help you improve your skills and at the same time you will gain a nationally recognised qualification. We run both daytime and evening classes at venues throughout the city, as well as online classes. Please note that even if you join an online course, we currently only offer face-to-face enrolments and exams are all paper-based, taken at one of our venues. Classes are 2% hours a week over the school year.

FUNCTIONAL SKILLS ENGLISH CLASSES

These classes focus on the English skills adults need in their everyday lives, in the workplace, in the community and in your home. There are five different levels from Entry 1 to the highest L2, which is equivalent to grade C or grade 4 at GCSE. Before you are enrolled onto an English course, you will receive advice & guidance and will be offered an initial assessment. This will help you make an informed choice about the best class for you.

SHORT ENGLISH COURSES

BRUSH UP YOUR ENGLISH

What is this course about?

It is about giving you as the learner some underpinning skills and knowledge around using the correct techniques to write clearly, logically and for the appropriate audience. It will also help with spelling, punctuation and grammar.

What will I learn?

The course is framed around the skills learners need in the world of work such as how to write letters, emails, articles and reports with the underpinning skills being spelling, writing sentences differentiating when to use formal and informal language and using correct punctuation.



We strongly advise that you take **ONE GCSE in an academic year**. However, if you are uncertain which GCSE to apply for, or you have exceptional circumstances, you are welcome to sit both assessments to enable you to make an informed decision.

If you do not have a GCSE in the subject you are applying for at grade 9-4 (A* - C), the course is free.

If you do have a GCSE grade 4 (C) or above, and need a higher grade for a specific reason, please talk to Sarah or Matt as it may be possible to apply for funding. If you do not qualify for the support fund the fees are:

If you are offered a place on the course, you will be required to purchase a textbook. We also strongly recommend having access to a PC, laptop or tablet at home for online study. Details of this will be available at pre-course assessment.



FOUNDATION SKILLS COURSE

The Foundation Skills course consists of numeracy (maths), literacy (English) and Digital (IT).

If you have been out of education for a long time and want to take those first steps back into education and training this may be the course for you. It is aimed at learners who may have little or no maths or English skills and struggled with some of the basic maths and English concepts when at school or college.

This course uses a 'themed approach' to maths, English and IT and will be full of practical activities which will make the learning meaningful and relatable to work and daily life. Hopefully making some of those concepts you struggled with easier to grasp and understand. There is also the opportunity to gain a Functional Skills qualification in either maths or English.

All we ask for is that you can commit to the 4-week course with 3-days of classes each week.
