## Child Criminal Exploitation

Child Criminal Exploitation occurs where an individual or group takes advantage of an imbalance of power to coerce, control, manipulate or deceive a child into criminal activity in exchange for something of value the victim needs or wants.

This can be material items (e.g. cash, drugs, alcohol or gifts) or it might be human needs (e.g. protection, status or feeling of belonging

The victim may have been criminally exploited even if the activity appears consensual

Child Criminal Exploitation does not always involve physical contact, it can also occur through the use of technology.

## Risk factors include:

- Going missing from home or school
- Suddenly having lots of money or new possessions that they cannot account for
- Receiving more calls/texts than usual
- Being very protective of their mobile phone or having multiple phones or SIM cards
- Using new language, words or hand signs you wouldn't expect them to know
- Changing their appearance, e.g. particular style, colours
- Refusing to enter certain streets or parts of the city
- Self-harming and substance misuse issues
- Carrying drugs, large amounts of money or weapons

- Changes in behaviour e.g. being scared, aggressive, distant or angry
- Talking about an individual or group who have a lot of influence over them
- Hanging around with older individuals or groups and breaking ties with old friends
- Dropping out of positive activities and hobbies
- Unexplained physical injuries and/or refusal to seek or accept medical treatment
- Travelling alone to places far from home or being found by services out of area
- Unexplained bus or train tickets

If you think a child is in immediate danger always call the emergency services on 999.
