You have requested the following information:

Under the Freedom of Information Act 2000, I would like to request the following information regarding adult neurological and mental health services.

For the avoidance of doubt, when referring to the terms 'neurological' and 'neurological care need', please include; brain injury (including acquired brain injury and traumatic brain injury), spinal injury, neuro-disabilities (including but not limited to Parkinson's disease, early-onset dementia, multiple sclerosis, motor neurone disease, Huntington's disease, cerebral palsy and epilepsy), stroke, neurobehavioural rehabilitation and cognitive rehabilitation.
