- · 85% of service users to demonstrate a measurable overall positive change in their behaviours and attitudes between engagement and discharge.
- · 90% of comprehensive assessments completed within 10 working days of referral into the service (indicate the number of cases not comprehensively assessed due to an external issue, i.e. service user on holiday).
- 90% of the designated vulnerable children and young people to have an initial assessment within 2 working days of referral (indicate the number of cases not initially assessed due to an external

issue, i.e. service user on holiday)

- 90% of messages seeking support from a professional, parent/carer or child/young person to be answered within one working day.
- 90% of young people to have commenced transition planning into the Adult Treatment Service at least 6 months prior to their 18th birthday.
- 90% of service users supported for over 20 weeks to have a discharge plan.
