

Reading and English

These are links to support reading, literacy and other aspects of English learning. The first set of links are suitable for all age groups. They are then split into different Year groups to help you find the right resources for your child.

Suitable for all ages

Reading

If you already have a library card then check out the <u>e-resources all available for free</u>, there are e-books, e-magazines and comics, audiobooks and even e-newspapers so there is something for all the members of the family to enjoy. Don't worry if you don't already have a library card as you can register online and get a temporary membership.

<u>The Reading Realm</u> have lots of video resources to support reading and literacy with quizzes, author interviews and sharing books online, including material on poetry and illustration.

Parents can learn more about how to support their child's reading by visiting Oxford Owl's <u>Reading pages</u> including phonics top tips and over 100 free e-books for children aged from 3-11.

Free download from publishers Barrington Stoke on how to <u>support dyslexic children</u> with their reading when home learning including links to lots of useful resources and activities.

The Reading Agency's Summer Reading Challenge_website has a <u>home zone</u> which has lots of free resources and information to encourage reading for pleasure.

The books and reading section of the <u>Book Trust's website</u> has some really useful information to help children find the right book. They have recommended book lists, a bookfinder that will give you targeted recommendations and tips and advice for parents.

Literacy/English learning resources

<u>Words for Life</u> is the National Literacy Trust's website for parents. It has lots of fun activities, suggestions on things you can do together to support literacy and tips from top authors.

<u>Make your own comics</u> with these downloadable resources created by Seven Stories - The National Centre for Children's Books

<u>Spelling Frame</u> has all the words - both statutory and the example words - from the National Curriculum for Spelling for Year 1 to Year 6. Choose a spelling rule and each word is read aloud and provided within a sentence for context. There are also free spellings game to play to help support phonics learning.

Poetry

Brilliant collection of free resources to support learning about poetry from the <u>Children's</u> <u>Poetry Archive</u>. Includes poems organised by theme, age group and searchable by poet, poem name or lyric. Includes interviews with poets, and audio clips of poems being read aloud

Dual Language
