Thank you for your request for information relating to breach of planning permission.

You have requested the following information:

I was wondering if it's possible to receive the following information:

## 1. The number of times a breach of planning permission occurred

### 2. The reason for the breach of planning permission

For Questions 1 and 2, we hold the information which you have asked for, but we have estimated that the cost of meeting your request would exceed the cost limit of £450 specified in the Freedom of Information and Data Protection (Appropriate Limit and Fees Regulations 2004). This represents the estimated cost of one person spending 18 hours or more, in determining whether the information is held, locating, retrieving and extracting it.

We estimate that because the information is held in a nonreportable format which would require an officer to manually review over 4,000 records which has been estimated to take approximately 339 hours to complete. This exceeds the 18-hour limit under Act. Your request has been refused under section 12(2) of the Act.

# 3. The number of fines handed out and cost due to breach of planning permission

We confirm that we do not hold this information and are advising you as per Section 1(1) of the

Act. The City Council does not issue fines for breaches of planning control. If a serious breach of planning control is identified and informal attempts to remedy the harm fail, an enforcement notice is served. It is an offence not to comply with an enforcement notice. A person guilty of such an offence is liable on conviction to a fine to be determined by the Courts.

The supply of information in response to a FOI/EIR request does not confer an automatic right to re-use the information.
