Thank you for your request for information relating to Parking Permits.

You have requested the following information:

- 1. What is the current cost of an annual residential parking permit within your council? £10 per year.
- 2. How many residential parking permits were issued in the following timeframes:

1st January 2020 - 31st December 2020: 8,033

1st January 2021 - 31st December 2021: 8,093

1st January 2022 - 31st December 2022: 3,097

1st January 2023 - 31st December 2023: 3,485

1st January 2024 - 31st December 2024: 9,229

3. Please provide the cost of an annual residential parking permit over the last five years, detailing any changes in price each year.

Prior to 2024/25, the cost varied depending on the parking scheme it related to. Some permits were free of charge, some schemes were £20 for a three year permit. With effect from 2024/2025 the unit cost for all permits across all schemes (with the exception of the Coventry Building Society parking scheme) is £10 for an annual permit.

4. How much revenue has the council received from residential parking permits over the past five years, broken down by calendar year? The following information is based on financial year as we do not hold the information by calendar year:

2019/2020: £28,468

2020/2021: £15,551 2021/2022: £58,703 2022/2023: £34,903 2023/2024: £34,451

2024/2025 (to date): £100,031

5. Does the cost of an annual parking permit differ depending on the street, zone, or area? If so, please provide the price range and the rationale for any variations in cost.

Historically, it has differed. Schemes where permits were provided free of charge were implemented using Section 106 Developer Funding / contributions.
