Cancellation Charges


- Cancellation fees will apply to ALL agencies & training, in the event of the delegate not attending or a substitute delegate not being identified

The training also covers professional expectations when working with children and families, the importance of professional curiosity and understanding consent, and offers top tips for effective engagement with children and families.


