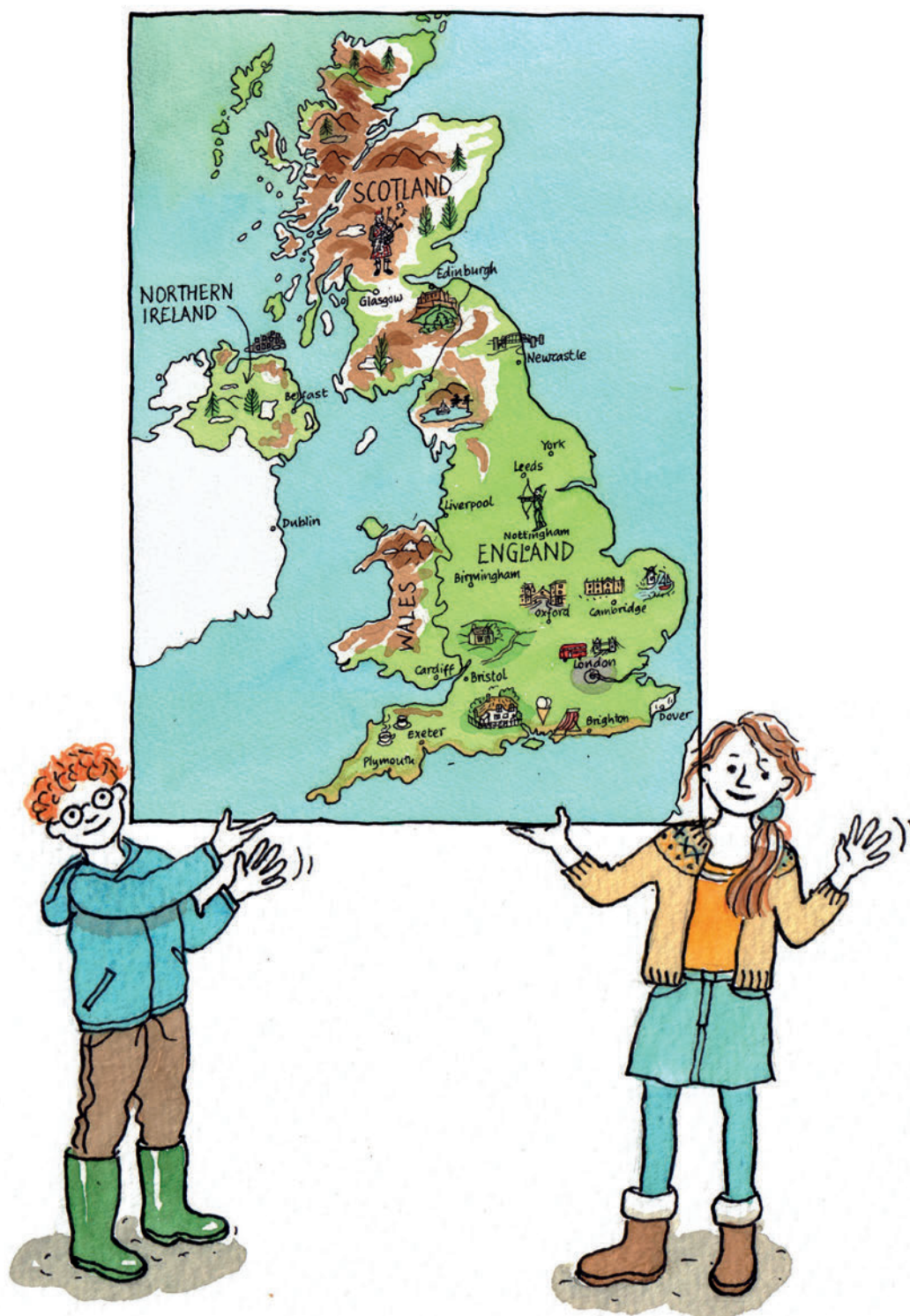

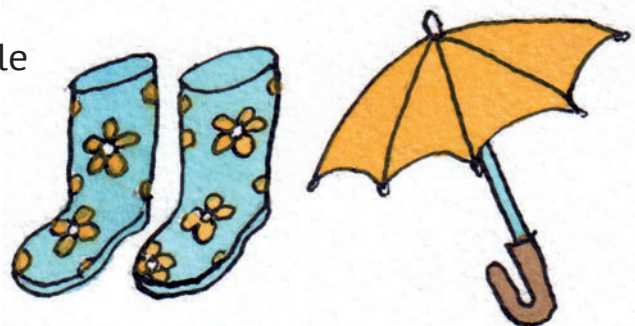

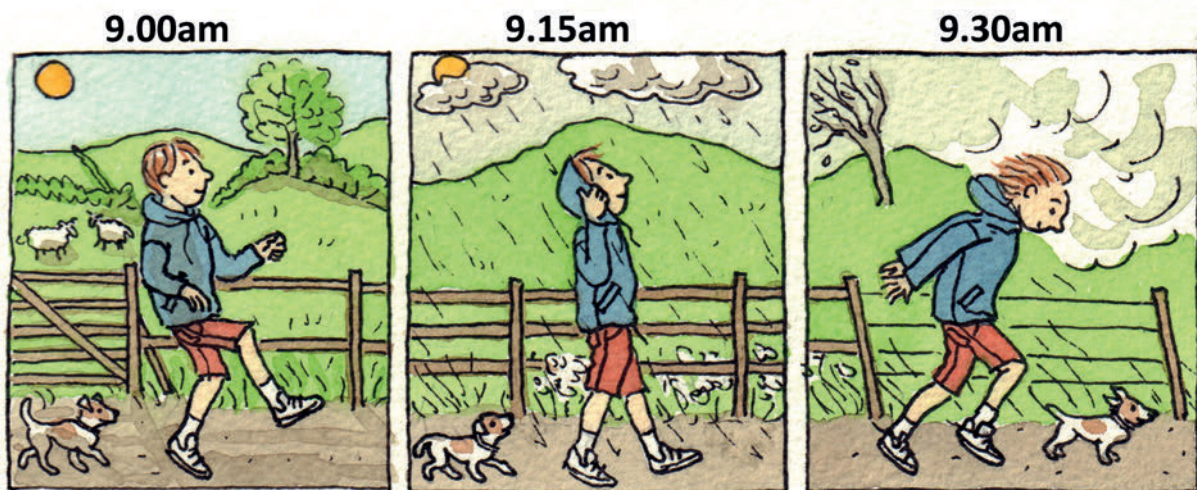

Fun Fact: British people are so used to the rain that most people will own an umbrella and wellington boots (also known as a brolly and wellies).



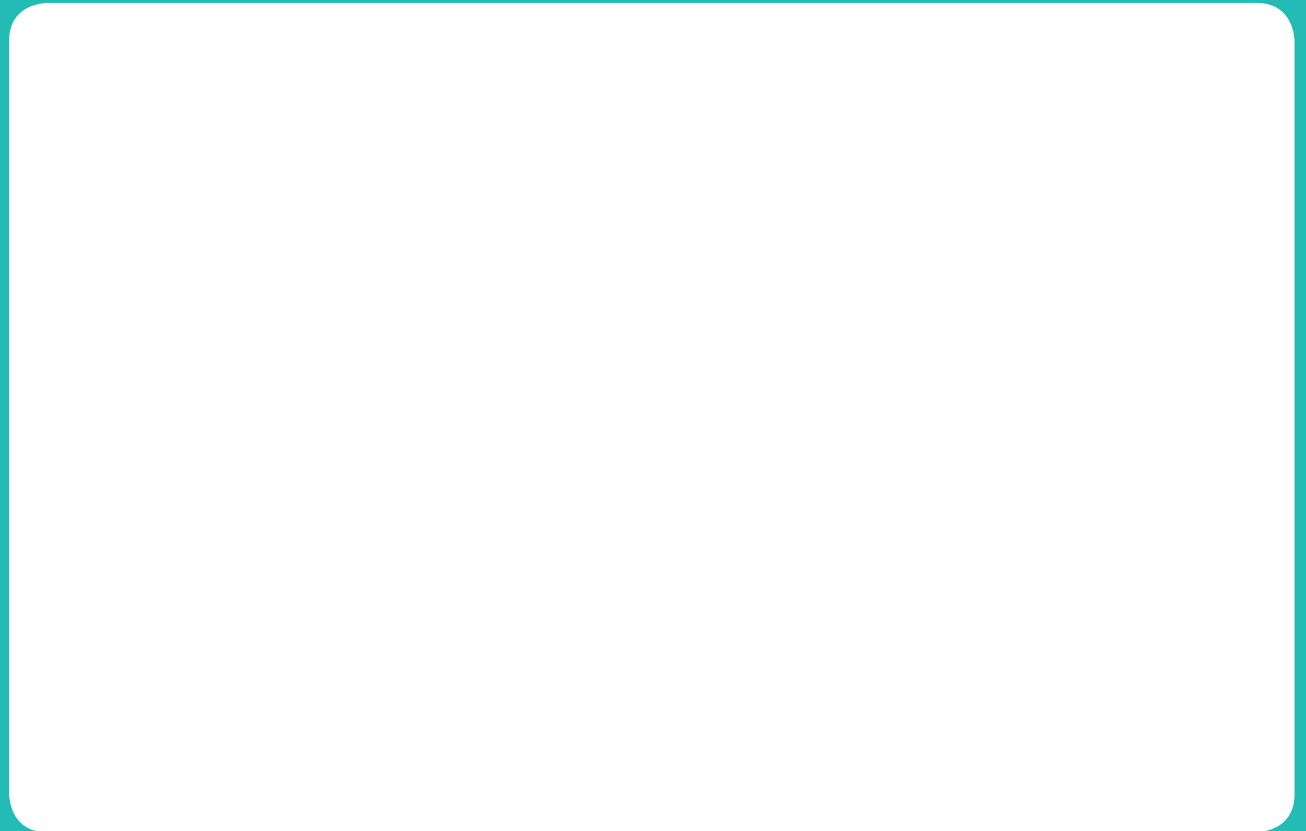
The weather can change in the space of one hour.

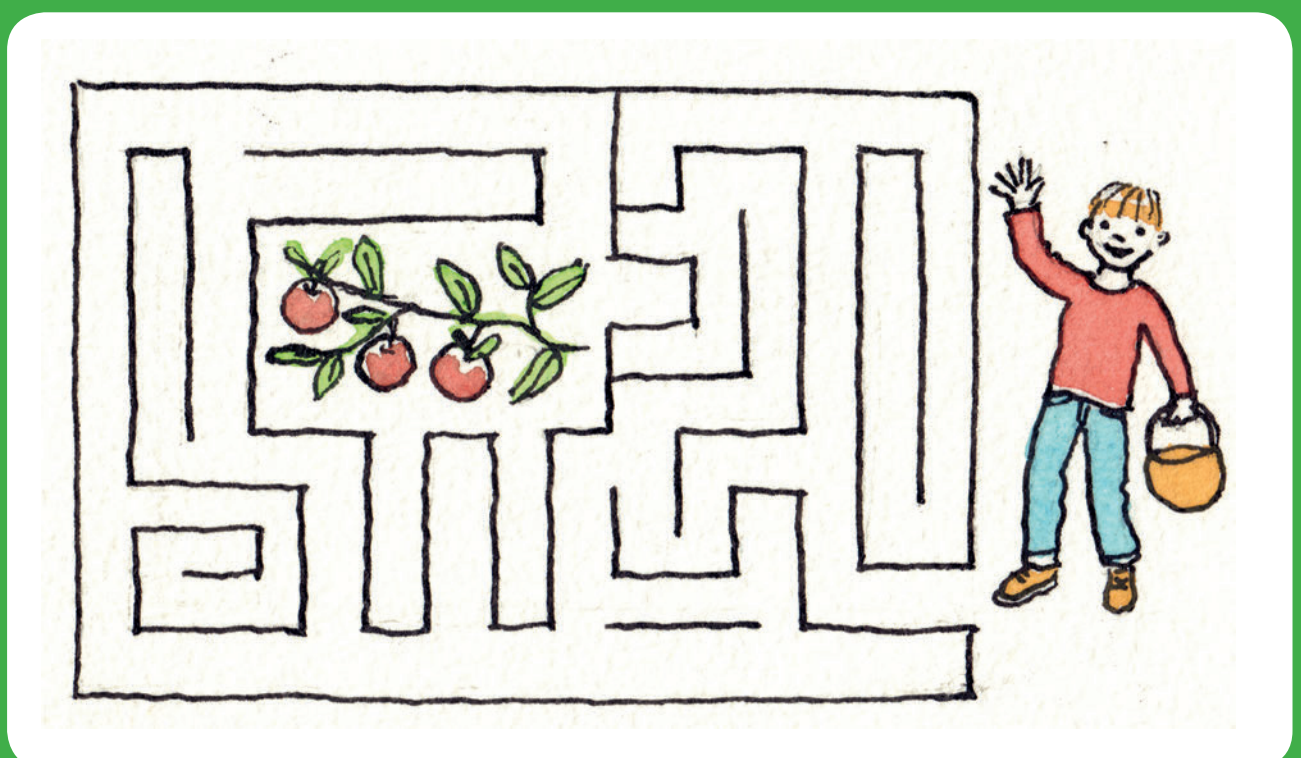
Colour in this spring daffodil as shown.

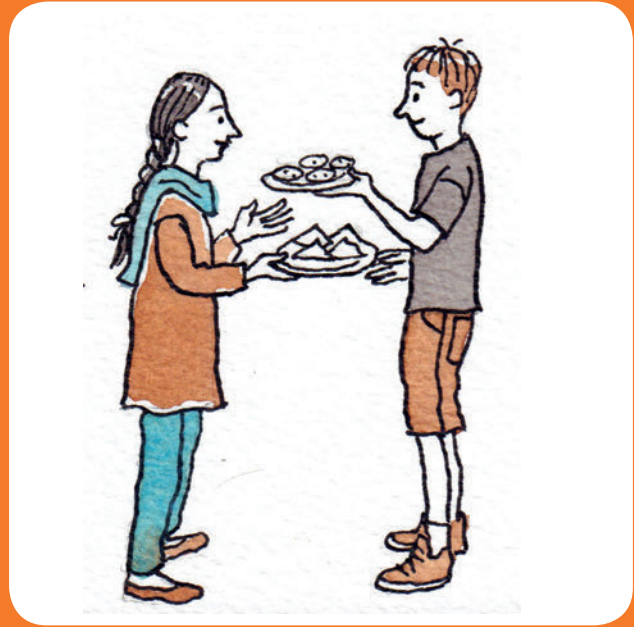


