Wild Earth delivers high-quality nature-based alternative provision designed to support children and young people's personal growth, mental health, and education. Our flagship programme, Stepping Stones, offers a flexible, tailored approach – available for up to three days per week – combining outdoor learning, bushcraft, and allotment-based activities. We specialise in building confidence, resilience, teamwork, and emotional regulation through positive connection with nature. Each learner's journey is co-designed with schools, parents/carers, and the young person, ensuring it meets individual needs and aligns with educational outcomes. Our experienced practitioners are skilled in working with children with SEND, SEMH, and those at risk of exclusion. Provision is delivered in small group settings or one-to-one where needed, with a strong focus on safety, engagement, and measurable progress. Wild Earth provides a calm, supportive environment where young people can thrive, reconnect with learning, and develop skills for future success.



What we offer



Pastoral support at Wild Earth focuses on the whole child, offering a safe, nurturing space where young people feel heard and valued. We provide one-to-one check-ins, emotional regulation strategies, mentoring, and guided reflection to build resilience, self-esteem, and a sense of belonging, supporting overall wellbeing and engagement with learning.
