COURSES REQUIRING AN INTERVIEW

When you find a course on our website you are interested in joining, it may say you need to attend an appointment for an enrolment interview to join. We conduct interviews so that we can make sure the course is at an appropriate level for you and to check whether you are eligible for government funding. (If not, you will still be able to join, but there will be a fee to do so.)

IMPORTANT - when attending an enrolment interview, you must bring the following:

IDENTIFICATION:

If you are a UK National, please bring your birth certificate, driving licence or British passport.

If you are an EU citizen, please bring your passport/ID card and a share code generated within the last 90 days.

If you are currently seeking Asylum, please bring your ARC card and Aspen card (if applicable).

Otherwise, you will need to generate a sharecode for your online eVisa document to prove your residency status.

(If you have not yet applied for your eVisa, please bring your residence permit (BRP), passport with visa or whatever documentation you have that shows your residency status.)

EVIDENCE OF RELEVANT BENEFITS OR INCOME:

If your gross personal income is less than £34,194 per annum. (This is one of the criteria that allow us to claim government funding.)

LANGUAGE SKILLS

MODERN FOREIGN LANGUAGES - SPANISH

LIFE SKILLS

We offer a range of exciting courses to build confidence, improve health and wellbeing, develop new skills, gain qualifications and equip parents and carers to support their children's learning.

FAMILY LEARNING

Free Family Learning courses and programmes include:

Maths/English in the Primary School (adults only) - These courses help parents and carers to understand how these subjects are taught in Modern British Primary Schools. Each week you will be given fun games to take home and play with your children. There is an online pre-recorded version of this course if you cannot attend a face-to-face course.

Positive Family Foundations (adults only) - A nurture-based, practical advice programme providing insight on how children aged 0 - 10 years old interact with their parent/carers and what children need to thrive. The NCFE Entry 2 Creative Craft is an intensive 10-week course where you will be working in a range of mediums in preparation for a final piece.

Once we have received your application, we will contact you to complete the enrolment process, provide advice, guidance and a small assessment.

The Leisure Programme offers competitively priced courses for pleasure. These courses are not tied to funding, no longer require as much progress and achievement tracking while still developing your skills and knowledge across a range of disciplines. Courses include: Ballroom & Latin, Modern Jazz, Line Dancing, Tap Dancing Improvers, Art - Oils and Acrylics Improvers, Art - Watercolour & Mixed Media - Intermediate,

and Art - Intermediate Acrylic painting.

The Leisure Programme also includes extensive Piano and Music Theory courses. Offered at all levels of playing: beginner lessons, graded lessons and 1:1 lessons with opportunities to take external accredited exams.

ESSENTIAL SKILLS







The Foundation Skills Course is designed for learners returning to education who want to build confidence in Maths, English, and Digital Skills. Ideal for those with little or no prior knowledge, it uses a practical, themed approach to make learning relevant to everyday life and work. The 6-week course runs 2 days a week and offers the opportunity to work towards a stepping stone qualification in either English or Maths

MATHS, ENGLISH & DIGITAL FUNCTIONAL SKILLS COURSES

Our Maths, English, and Digital Functional Skills courses help adults build essential skills for everyday life, work, and further education, leading to nationally recognised qualifications. We offer daytime, evening, and online classes, with face-to-face enrolment and paper-based exams at our venues. Courses run 2½ hours per week over the school year. Maths covers practical skills like problem solving, fractions, percentages, and interpreting data. English focuses on reading, writing, speaking, and listening to boost confidence at home, work, and in the community. Digital Functional Skills (Entry Level 3 and Level 1) include; using devices, communicating, creating and editing documents, online transactions, and staying safe online. All learners receive initial assessments to join the level best suited to their ability.



MATHS & ENGLISH Our Brush Up Courses in English and Maths offer a short, five-week learning opportunity designed to build confidence and strengthen essential skills in a supportive environment. The English Brush Up course focuses on spelling, punctuation, grammar, and writing clearly for different audiences, including practical skills for letters, emails, articles, and reports. The

SHORT

Maths Brush Up course helps you develop everyday numeracy skills—such as budgeting, shopping, and planning projects without the pressure of formal exams. These courses run every half term until June 2026 and can also prepare you for further Functional Skills study.

DIGITAL SKILLS COURSES

Would you like the opportunity to work for an employer, earn an apprenticeship salary and gain valuable workplace skills and experience in your chosen area of work? Age is not a barrier, if you are aged over 16 years of age, this is a great way to start or progress your career.

We offer a range of apprenticeship training from Level 2 to Level 5 in a range of areas including Customer Service, Business Administration, Early Years, Health Care Support Worker, Teaching Assistant, Team Leading plus Operational Management.

PATHWAYS TO EMPLOYMENT

We understand that everyone's journey is different and that the support and guidance you need differs. You may know what you want but need to enhance your skills, or alternatively you may feel 'lost' or 'stuck' and need help to uncover your strengths. We therefore have designed various short courses (Sprint Ahead, Skills to Success & our Journey Exploration Programme) with this in mind. Our courses are typically delivered at the Job Shop, enabling you to have the full support and guidance of the Job Coaches & Employment Engagement team.

In addition are you over the age of 19? Are you in receipt of Universal Credit? Are you linked with a Disability Engagement Officer at the DWP? If so our **Stairway to Work** programme will help put you on the right track to being work ready. This short course will give you the opportunity to enhance your preemployment skills whilst also building on key areas such as self-esteem, self-confidence and helping you focus on your next steps.



EARLY YEARS AND TEACHING ASSISTANT INTO EMPLOYMENT COURSES

Are you looking for work? Are you over the age of 19? Unemployed and in receipt of benefit? Or working and on a low wage? Here is an ideal opportunity!

This short course will help support you in your chosen career, whilst also providing application and interview support and a quaranteed job interview with a local employer within this area.

Alternatively, are you an employer, struggling to recruit to vacancies? Trailing this fully funded route to secure staff is a tried and tested way to get keen, new staff members.
