Effective Support for Children & Families in Coventry

This training reflects our new ways of working, emphasizing relational and restorative approaches. It provides thorough explanations of Early Help processes, including how to access services and meet the threshold for statutory intervention. The training also covers professional expectations when working with children and families, the importance of professional curiosity and understanding consent, and offers top tips for effective engagement with children and families.
