West Midlands Fire Service

The Authority is responsible for the governance of West Midlands Fire Service.

Our vision is "Making the West Midlands safer, stronger and healthier"

Our three-year strategy is based on our Community Risk Management Plan (CRMP), which identifies and assesses all foreseeable risks which our communities may face.

We use our CRMP to inform our Service Delivery Model - how we use our resources to reduce risk and vulnerability.

Our focus on community risk reduction includes:

RESPONSE - Responding safely, assertively and effectively to fires and other emergencies.

We are your fire and rescue service, here when you need us. We are hugely proud of what we do and what we have done to get here. We respond locally, nationally and internationally, saving lives, preventing harm, and safeguarding homes and businesses with the resources you need, when you need them.

PREVENTION - Delivering activities which support safer and healthier communities

By focusing on people most at risk, we improve their quality of life through reducing their risk of fire, helping them to lead healthier lives and educating them on how to be safer on our roads.

PROTECTION - Protecting life and property to make businesses stronger and communities safer

We inspect high-risk and tall buildings, including flats, hospitals, schools and businesses, to keep safe the people who live and work there. We also advise companies on fire safety legislation, to keep their staff and customers safe and help their businesses to grow. In cases of significant risk, we can take enforcement action, including prosecution.

How many people work for the Authority?

The table below gives details of the budgeted staffing establishment of the West Midlands Fire and Rescue Authority. Numbers are shown as full-time equivalent posts:

How much does the service cost?

The table below details the West Midlands Fire and Rescue Authority's revenue budget for the financial years 2025/26 and 2026/27:

Council Tax Requirement	£61.296m	£65.749m

At 31st March 2025, the Authority's borrowing was £27.5m.

Band D requirement for 2026/27 is £85.19 which equates to an increase of £5.00 per household compared to 2025/26.

Who pays for it?

The West Midlands Fire and Rescue Authority precept is the part of the council tax which pays for the fire service. The total amount of precept for each West Midlands Council is shown below:

Why has the Council Tax requirement changed?


The Authority's council tax requirement for 2026/27 is £65.749m compared with £61.296m for 2025/26, an increase of £4.453m. This change is analysed in the table below:


How is the budget spent and financed?
