The details we require are:

1. What are the contractual performance KPI's for this contract?

All works are to be delivered in accordance with the latest version of the Department for Education (DfE) Output Specification and Employer's Requirements, where there is conflict between this specification and the DfE OS, the requirements within the Employer's requirements take precedent. Otherwise as per supplemental provision 9 does not apply in this instance.

2. Suppliers who applied for inclusion on each framework/contract and were successful & not successful at the PQQ & ITT stages

The Contract has been awarded in alignment with Section 41 of the Procurement Act 2023 on Technical Grounds there were no PQQ or ITT Stage.

3. Actual spend on this contract/framework (and any sub lots), from the start of the contract to the current date

£52,579.72.

4. Start date & duration of framework/contract?

01/03/2026 to 28/02/2027.

5. Could you please provide a copy of the service/product specification given to all bidders for when this contract was last advertised?

There were no PQQ or ITT Stage. The supplier has been formally appointed by the Department for Education through a further competition process conducted by MACE/LocatED under Crown Commercial Service DPS RM6313 (Demand Management and Renewables Lot 1) to deliver the Great British Energy Solar Partnership (GBESP) programme.

This direct award is necessary to enable the Council to access the GBESP grant-funded energy efficiency and renewable energy measures as only the DfE appointed delivery partner is authorised and contracted to perform these installations under the national programme. Accordingly, no alternative provider is capable of delivering the required services within the conditions of the grant, and the statutory criteria for a direct award under Section 41 are satisfied on technical ground.

6. Is there an extension clause in the framework(s)/contract(s) and, if so, the duration of the extension?

The contract does not include a single, automatic “extension clause” in the way some frameworks do. Instead, the JCT 2016 Design and Build Contracts provides mechanisms for extending the contract period through Extensions of Time (EOT). These are granted where delays occur due to Relevant Events (such as variations, employer changes, or certain unforeseen circumstances), with the duration of any extension assessed on a case-by-case basis by the Employer’s Agent.

7. Has a decision been made yet on whether the framework(s)/contract(s) are being either extended or renewed?
