

CITY OF COVENTRY
(JUDDS LANE AND ROWLEY'S GREEN LANE) (NO STOPPING AT ANY
TIME AND WAITING RESTRICTIONS) ORDER 2026

The Council of the City of Coventry (hereinafter referred to as “the Council”), which for the avoidance of doubt includes any agent acting on the behalf of, in exercise of the powers conferred by Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 99, 100 and Parts III and IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (“the Act of 1984”), as amended and by virtue of Section 74 and paragraph 8(4) of Schedule 8 of the Traffic Management Act 2004 (“the 2004 Act”) and of all other enabling powers the City of Coventry being a Civil Enforcement Area (CEA) and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act of 1984 hereby makes the following Order

PART I

CITATION AND INTERPRETATION

Citation

- 1.1 This Order shall come into operation on the **XXth XXX 2026** and may be cited as the City of Coventry (Judd’s Lane and Rowley’s Green Lane)(No Stopping At Any Time and Waiting Restrictions) Order 2026
- 1.2 The City of Coventry (Citywide) (Permitted Parking Area and Special Parking Area)(Designation, Waiting Restrictions, Loading Restrictions, Loading Areas and Street Parking Places) Consolidation Order 2016 (as amended) shall be modified and/or varied by this Order in so far as it relates to the restrictions as shown in map tiles S9, S10, T9 as attached to this Order.

Interpretation

- 2 In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:-

“ambulance” has the same meaning as in the Vehicle Excise and Registration Act 1994;

“authorised officer” means a person authorised by or on behalf of the Council to supervise any parking place or in respect of any civil enforcement of parking contraventions a person who is authorised to use an approved device

“authorised parking place” means any parking place on a road authorised or designated by this Order;

'bus' has the same meaning as defined in Schedule 1 of the 2016 Regulations

"carriageway" means a way constituting or comprised in a highway being a way (other than a cycle track) over which the public have a right of way for the passage of vehicles;

"City of Coventry" in relation to this Order means the City of Coventry as designated by the Road Traffic (Permitted Parking Area and Special Parking Area)(City of Coventry) Order 2005

"Civil Enforcement Officer" shall have the meaning assigned by Section 76 of the Traffic Management Act 2004.

"coach" shall for the purposes of this Order have the same meaning as bus

"disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exceptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000;

"disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in Section 142 of the 1984 Act;

"driver", in relation to a vehicle waiting in a parking place or on a road or length of road, means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left in that parking place or road or length of road;

"enactment" means any enactment, whether public general or local, and includes any order, byelaw, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment and any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment;

"footway" has the meaning given by section 329(1) of the Highways Act 1980 (c.66)

"issuing authority" means the Council

"loading" means the transfer of goods to a vehicle and where the definition "unloading" is used within, it shall also be conferred that the act of loading is included in that act;

"local bus" has the same meaning as defined in Schedule 1 of the 2016 Regulations

"map schedule" means a collection of map tiles attached to this Order and listed in Schedule 2, which depicts the stopping, waiting, loading or unloading prohibitions and restrictions and parking places and parking areas designated by this Order, and in conjunction with the map schedule legend and/or map tile label, identifies the type of each particular prohibition, restriction or parking place and, if appropriate, certain of its governing provisions: Provided that the Council does not accept responsibility for inaccuracies contained in the Ordnance Survey data relied upon to create the map based schedule and where a parking place or

parking area is depicted on the map based schedule, that parking place or parking area will continue to apply irrespective of any subsequent changes that have been made to the underlying Ordnance Survey data;

“map schedule legend” means the map schedule legend attached to this Order which, when used in conjunction with a map tile as listed in Schedule 2 to this Order, identifies the specific type of parking places or parking areas designated by this Order and, where appropriate, certain of their governing provisions;

“map tile” means an individual map with a specific tile reference, being part of the map based schedule as listed in Schedule 2 to this Order;

“map tile label” where shown on a map tile forming part of the map schedule to this Order in relation to a stopping, waiting, loading or unloading prohibition or restriction and a parking place or parking area, means a label which indicates the type of prohibition, restriction or parking place or parking area and, if appropriate, certain of its governing provisions;

“motorcycle” and “invalid carriage” have the same meanings as in Section 136 of the Act of 1984;

"owner", in relation to a vehicle means the person by whom the vehicle is kept. In determining who was the owner at any time it shall be presumed that the owner was the person named in the vehicle registration document as the registered keeper of that vehicle or the person who has the use of the vehicle in the course of his / her employment and who is entitled to use such a vehicle as though he / she were the registered keeper thereof;

“parking place” means a road or length of road, which is provided for the waiting of vehicles and specified on the map tile;

"pedal cycle" has the same meaning as ascribed to it in Section 192 of the Road Traffic Act 1988;

“penalty charge” means a charge payable in accordance with The Civil Enforcement of Road Traffic Contraventions (Approved Devices, Charging Guidelines and General Provisions) (England) Regulations 2022 in respect of a parking contravention specified in paragraph 4 of Schedule 7 of the 2004 Act;

"penalty charge notice" means a notice issued by a Civil Enforcement Officer pursuant to the provisions of The Civil Enforcement of Road Traffic Contraventions (Approved Devices, Charging Guidelines and General Provisions) (England) Regulations 2022 (S.I. 2022/71);

‘private hire vehicle’ means a vehicle licensed under section 48 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 or any similar enactment

“prohibited hours” means in relation to any prohibited road the hours during which waiting or loading is prohibited as specified on the map tile;

“prohibited road” means any of the sides or lengths of roads specified on the map tile where waiting or stopping is prohibited provided that the expression “prohibited road” shall not include any parking place;

“red route” has the same meaning as in Schedule 1 of the 2016 Regulations.

“relevant position” in respect of: -

- (a) a disabled person’s badge and parking disc has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000; and

“restricted hours” means in relation to any restricted road the hours during which waiting is restricted as specified on the map tile;

“restricted road” means any of the sides or lengths of road specified on the map tile to this Order where waiting or stopping is restricted OR specific activities are restricted during the restricted hours provided that the expression “restricted road” shall not include any parking place;

"road" shall have the same meaning ascribed to it in section 142 of the 1984 Act and for the avoidance of doubt shall include the whole width of the road up to the boundary of the adjacent properties including the verge;

"telecommunication system" has the same meaning as in the Telecommunications Act 1984;

"the 2004 Act" means the Traffic Management Act 2004

"the 2016 Regulations" means the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016 and includes any amendment or reenactment thereto;

"traffic manager" means that officer nominated as such by the Council as required by the 2004 Act

“traffic sign” means a sign of any size, colour and type prescribed or authorised pursuant to or having the effect as though prescribed or authorised pursuant to Section 64 of the Act of 1984 or as approved by the DfT;

“unloading” means the transfer of goods from a vehicle and where the definition “loading” is used within, it shall also be conferred that the act of unloading is included in that act;

"vehicle" means:-

- i) a mechanically and or electrically propelled vehicle intended or adapted for use on the road
- ii) a pedal cycle in actual use for the purposes of cycling

which for the avoidance of doubt shall include the whole or any part of a vehicle

3. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
4. Except where otherwise stated, any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order and any reference to a map tile is a reference to a map tile incorporated into this Order;
5. The prohibitions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any restriction, prohibition or requirement imposed by any Regulations or Orders made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984, or by or under any other enactment.
6. In the event any provision of this Order conflicts or is inconsistent with any provision of any other Order made or having effect as if made under the Act, or by any other enactment, the provisions of this Order shall prevail and take precedence
7. Save where the contrary is indicated, any reference in this Order to:-
 - (a) this Order or another Order shall be construed as such a reference to this Order or, as the case may be, such other Order, as the same may have been or may from time to time be amended, varied or supplemented;
 - (b) a Statute or Regulation shall be construed as reference to such Statute or Regulations as the same may have been, or may from time to time be amended or re-enacted.
8. The Council has set penalty charge levels payable in respect of any parking contraventions specified in The Civil Enforcement of Road Traffic Contraventions (Approved Devices, Charging Guidelines and General Provisions) (England) Regulations 2022
9. The Council will take enforcement action in respect of parking contraventions as follows: -
 - (a) in accordance with The Civil Enforcement of Road Traffic Contraventions (Approved Devices, Charging Guidelines and General Provisions) (England) Regulations 2022 and for this purpose it may use an "Approved Device" as defined in The Civil Enforcement of Parking Contraventions (Approved Devices) (England) Order 2007 SI 2007/3486
 - (b) the Council's Civil Enforcement Officers (CEO) shall wear uniform when exercising the functions specified in Regulation 2 of The Civil Enforcement (Wearing of Uniform) (England) Regulations 2007 SI 2007/3485 namely giving notification of a Penalty Charge, immobilising a vehicle and removal of parked and abandoned vehicles

(c) the Council will comply with the provisions relating to representation and appeals specified in The Civil Enforcement of Road Traffic Contraventions (Representations and Appeals) (England) Regulations 2022

(d) the Council's CEO will remove vehicles left on a road in a Civil Enforcement Area in accordance with The Removal and Disposal of Vehicles (Amendment) (England) Regulations 2007 SI 2007/3484

- 10 A further Penalty Charge shall be payable for each additional day or part of a day during which the vehicle is left in contravention of any prohibitions or restrictions imposed by this Order. Any additional penalty is to be paid in the manner detailed in Article 9a of this Order.
- 11 In the case of conflict between the provisions of this Order and the 2004 Act and any subordinate legislation made under it then that legislation takes priority

PART II

PROHIBITION AND RESTRICTION OF STOPPING, WAITING, LOADING AND UNLOADING

Prohibition of Stopping

12. Save as provided in Articles 15 to 19 no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer in uniform or Police Constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to stop at any time on any prohibited road as specified in Map Tiles shown in Schedule 2

Prohibition of Waiting

13. Save as provided in Articles 15 to 17 no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer in uniform or Police Constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on any prohibited road as specified Map Tiles shown in Schedule 2

Prohibition of Loading

14. Save as provided in Articles 15 to 17 no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer in uniform or Police Constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time for the purpose of enabling goods to be loaded or unloaded from the vehicle on any prohibited road as specified Map Tiles shown in Schedule 2

Emergency Services

15. Nothing in Articles 12 to 14, 20 and 21 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in any of the roads, lengths of road or on the sides of road specified therein for so long as may be necessary to enable the vehicle to be used for fire and rescue, ambulance or police purposes:

General exemptions

16. Nothing in Articles 12 to 14, 20 and 21 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to stop in any of the roads, lengths of road or on the sides of road specified therein for so long as may be necessary to enable:
- (a) a person to alight only from a Hackney Carriage
 - (b) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely:-
 - (i) building, shop fitting, industrial or demolition operations;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said lengths or sides of road; and
 - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the said lengths or sides of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications system.
 - (c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purposes in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or its contractors in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - (d) the vehicle of the Royal Mail or other universal service provider (as defined in section 4(3) and (4) of the Postal Services Act 2000) to be used for the purpose of delivering and/or collecting mail
 - (e) the vehicle to be used to facilitate a funeral or wedding service;
 - (f) in any case where the person in control of the vehicle,
 - (i) is required by law to stop;
 - (ii) is obliged to stop so as to prevent an accident, or
 - (iii) is prevented from proceeding by circumstances outside their control;
 - (g) to enable a disabled persons vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled persons badge, to stop for as long as is required to board or alight a person

17. Nothing in Articles 12 to 14 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to stop in any of the roads, lengths of road or sides of road upon an authorised parking place providing the said vehicle is of the class specified in Map Tiles shown in Schedule 2
18. Nothing in Article 12 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a pedal cycle "to stop for as long as may be required to board or alight from the vehicle"

Disabled Person's Vehicle

19. Nothing in Article 12 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge, to stop in the prohibited road referred to in Schedule 2 for so long as may be required to board or alight a disabled person

Bus and Coach Parking Place

20. Save as provided in Articles 15 to 17 no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer in uniform or Police Constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle other than a Bus to stop or wait at any time in any of the roads, lengths of road or on the sides of road designated as a Bus Parking Place as specified Map Tiles shown in Schedule 2

Movement and removal of vehicles

21. When a vehicle is waiting in contravention of the provision of Articles 12 to 14 a person authorised in that behalf by the Council may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle in order that its position shall comply with that provision.
22. When a vehicle is left in contravention of any of the provisions contained in Articles 12 to 14 a person authorised in that behalf by the Council may remove the vehicle or arrange for it to be removed from that parking place:
23. Any person altering the position of or removing a vehicle by virtue of Articles 21 or 22 of this Order may do so by towing or driving the vehicle or in such other manner as he / she may think necessary and may take such measures in relation to the vehicle as he / she may think necessary to enable him to remove it or alter its position as the case may be.
24. When a person authorised by the Council removes or makes arrangements for the removal of a vehicle from a parking place by virtue of Article 22 of this Order, he / she shall make such arrangements as may be reasonably necessary for the safe custody of the vehicle.

PART III **CONTRAVENTION OF ORDER**

Contravention

25. If a vehicle is left in a parking place outside the permitted hours or in any road or length of road in contravention or without complying with the requirements of this Order a contravention shall have occurred and a Penalty Charge shall be payable and/or the vehicle may be removed from that location.

Penalty Charge Notice

26. In the case of vehicle in respect of which a penalty charge may have been incurred, it shall be the duty of a Civil Enforcement Officer to issue a Penalty Charge Notice, which shall include the information required by the 2004 Act.

Manner of payment of Penalty Charge

27. The owner of the vehicle in respect of which the Penalty Charge has been incurred shall pay the Penalty Charge to the Council as indicated on the Penalty Charge Notice.

Indications as evidence

28. The particulars given in the Penalty Charge Notice attached to a vehicle in accordance with Article 27 shall be treated as evidence in any proceedings relating to failure to pay such Penalty Charge.

Removal of vehicle

29. Where a Civil Enforcement Officer has removed or caused to be removed a vehicle in accordance with Articles 21 or 24,
- (a) he / she shall provide for the safe custody of the vehicle;
 - (b) the Council shall be entitled to recover from the person responsible such charges in respect of the removal, storage and disposal of the vehicle as it might prescribe from time to time;
 - (c) the provisions of the 1984 Act as amended shall apply to the disposal of such vehicles removed by or on behalf of the Council pursuant to this Article.
30. Nothing in Articles 21 to 25 in regards to the removal of a vehicle shall apply in respect of a vehicle displaying in a relevant position a valid disabled person's badge.

Restriction on removal of notices

31. Where a Penalty Charge Notice has been attached to a vehicle in accordance with the provisions of Article 26, no person, not being the driver of the vehicle, a Police Constable in uniform, a Civil Enforcement Officer or some other person duly authorised by the Council, shall remove the notice from the vehicle unless authorised to do so by the driver.

Immobilisation

32. If a vehicle is left after a Penalty Charge has been incurred, a Civil Enforcement Officer in uniform or a person acting under his direction may attach to the vehicle an immobilisation device and a notice in accordance with the requirements of Section 79 of the 2004 Act and that vehicle shall only be released from the device on payment of the Penalty Charge, or as the case may be a reduced penalty charge, along with such release fee as may be required by the Council.

Revocation of Existing Orders

33. The Orders specified in Schedule 1 are hereby revoked with effect from the date of this Order to the extent as detailed in Map Tiles shown in Schedule 2
