May Blossom Farm CIC provides a farm-based alternative provision programme for Coventry pupils, designed particularly for young people who are struggling in mainstream education due to neurodivergence, social, emotional and mental health (SEMH) needs, or wellbeing challenges

What we offer



Key features of the provision include:

Wellbeing-focused learning in a calm outdoor environment.

Practical, hands-on activities such as:

Animal care

Horticulture and gardening

Conservation and environmental projects

Basic cookery

Music and movement activities

Opportunities to gain recognised qualifications and awards, including:

NCFE Entry Level and Level 1 Occupational Studies

John Muir Award

AQA Unit Awards

Support to develop:

Confidence and self-esteem

Teamwork and communication skills

Emotional regulation and wellbeing

Employability and practical life skills

Delivery in a small, supportive setting with experienced teachers, teaching assistants and youth workers.

The farm itself offers access to animals including sheep, goats, donkeys, chickens and rabbits, alongside vegetable gardens, an orchard, sensory growing spaces and natural outdoor learning areas, providing an engaging environment for experiential learning.

Overall, May Blossom Farm's "Conditions for Growth" programme aims to improve pupils' wellbeing, engagement with learning and future opportunities through nature-based, therapeutic and vocational experiences



Student Outcomes

Students attending May Blossom Farm's alternative provision are expected to achieve improved wellbeing, increased confidence and stronger engagement with learning through nature-based and practical activities. They develop skills in teamwork, communication, animal care, horticulture and cooking, while working towards recognised qualifications such as NCFE Awards, AQA Unit Awards and the John Muir Award. The provision aims to help young people build resilience, enhance emotional regulation and prepare for future education, training or employment pathways.
