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Who we are

EK Outreach Services is a specialist SEND education service that provides personalised educational support to Local Authorities and schools across the UK for children and young people with Education, Health and Care Plans (EHCPs). Our core aim is to improve learning outcomes for students who have found accessing education challenging, whether due to complex SEND needs, SEMH presentations, anxiety, trauma, or other barriers to engagement. We offer bespoke, flexible and highly adaptive education programmes designed to meet each learner exactly where they are. We work with children and young people aged 5 to 25, offering teaching in a range of settings, including the home, school, community spaces such as libraries, and vocational environments. This flexibility ensures students can learn in the setting where they feel most regulated and ready to engage. Due to the personalised nature of our service, students can also access a wide range of accredited courses tailored to their interests, abilities and future pathways. Our outreach service may be commissioned as a long-term provision, short-term intervention, or a bridging package to support reintegration or transition to a new educational setting. We also provide several structured programmes that can be delivered in school or via a hybrid home-school model, including: • Exclusion Prevention Programme • Reintegration Programme • Transition Support Programme Each programme is designed to stabilise engagement, rebuild confidence, and support students back into sustainable education pathways.



What we offer



At EK Outreach Services, we understand that education is about more than academic learning – it is also about feeling supported, understood, and confident to face life's challenges. That is why our mentoring programme is a vital part of the work we do. Our mentors provide consistent, personalised support to students both during lessons and outside of them. Many of the children and young people we work with have experienced disrupted education, difficulties with confidence, or challenges linked to their special educational needs. Having a mentor by their side helps them to re-engage, build resilience, and achieve their potential. For many of our students, their mentor is the consistent person they can rely on – someone who understands their individual needs and believes in their ability to succeed. These trusted relationships often form the foundation on which academic and personal progress is built. At EK Outreach Services, we are proud of the impact our mentors have every day, helping the hardest-to-reach students find their pathway to success.

Student Outcomes

Student A Student Background as told by student "I have diagnoses of Autism, Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD), Oppositional Defiant Disorder (ODD), Obsessive Compulsive Disorder (OCD), Tourette syndrome, Bipolar Affective Disorder, and multiple anxiety disorders. I can find being around other people very difficult. Socialising is hard and, some days, it is just too much for me. I find change very difficult to manage, don't like it when things don't work out, or when computers are going slow. I also don't like it when bad things happen. These things can cause me to become overwhelmed by emotion. I can become very anxious or angry, and then this means that I snap and lash out or throw things, swear or become verbally abusive (at home)." Student A's EKOS experience Through expert teaching and mentoring support at EKOS, this student can travel independently, has built confidence as well as self-esteem and social skills to engage in the local community through their passion for politics, is better able to regulate emotions which makes for a happier and safer home life, and through great academic success has secured a place at University.
